It took years to be able to decide that for myself, and I assumed that once I took on this identity, it would only affect my life when it came to romantic and sexual relationships.

Instead, as soon as I began openly identifying as a lesbian, my entire community's attitude towards me changed. I soon realized that dissociating from men in my personal life was a political statement that would affect every part of my public life as well.

In the past two years, I have come to conceptualize lesbianism as a community politic that affects not only my dating and sex life, but also the people I am in community with, and the decisions I make about how to move through the world.

Lesbians refuse the prescribed societal role of relating to men intimately in the personal sphere; the political work of lesbianism is to dissociate from patriarchal masculinity in all areas of life. Thus, we open up the opportunity to build lives and communities on our own terms, outside of the male gaze.

Since lesbian lives inherently exist outside of the norm, our spaces become incredibly intentional.

Every lesbian I know is constantly asking questions to figure out exactly how the people around them want to be celebrated and supported.

I have been received with only love by other lesbians, and the grace with which I've seen lesbians carry themselves has completely changed my idea of what a healthy community looks like.
